



With their sweep of the Road America weekend, championship momentum has seemed to shift to the Prestige Performance pair of Hindman and Agostini. Their championship rivals will be working hard to ensure that the duo is unable to enjoy an equally successful weekend at VIRginia International Raceway later this month.

Lamborghini Super Trofeo North America will be back in action at VIRginia International Raceway later this month, Aug. 25-27.

Tape-delayed coverage of Road America will air on the CBS Sports Network on Aug. 27, 2017 at 3 p.m. ET. The coverage will feature live commentary on both the broadcast and live streams.

Lamborghini Super Trofeo races will be live-streamed on the following platforms: squadracorse.lamborghini.com, motortrendondemand.com and Internationally on imsa.tv and radiolemans.com. Tape-delayed coverage of each event will air on CBS Sports Network in primetime. The coverage will feature live commentary on both the broadcast and live streams.

The North American series continues to attract increasing numbers of competitors and interest.

The Lamborghini Huracán Super Trofeo adopts the V10 direct injection engine mounted on the road car, managed by a MoTeC control unit that delivers a maximum output of 620 horsepower. The frame is a hybrid carbon/aluminum construction with modified geometries to house an improved radiator up front and better accommodate the racing gearbox at the rear, which also provides better aerodynamics.

TRENT HINDMAN (No. 1 Prestige Performance, winner, first Pro):

"It was interesting. I saw what was going on out there in Riccardo's [Agostini] stint and he had a hell of a drive by the way. Just two awesome moves coming out of six. And that's where I was getting a little bit nervous on the pit wall seeing what was coming but at the end of the day the Prestige Performance/Wayne Taylor Racing guys gave us a fantastic car. Pit strategy was great. We were able to get out and get the lead and get clean air. That's where this car is the happiest. RICCARDO AGOSTINI(No. 1 Prestige Performance, winner, first Pro):

"It's not exactly what I planned but anyway, I struggled a bit during the first three or four laps to get into the pace and after that I lost two positions, so I was running in P4. From there I tried to get into my pace and tried to get closer to the top three guys, so I wanted to be as close as possible to the lead before the pit window opened. And that's what happened and I am really, really happy about this weekend. Trent did an amazing job after the pit stop and we have the championship lead now and hopefully for the next race we are fighting for the victory."
