



With their second-consecutive win, Hindman and Agostini move into the provisional points lead. Tomorrow they will try to increase that lead from one spot further back on the grid, starting next to their chief championship rival, Richard Antinucci who will look for redemption after a difficult first race at Road America.

Lamborghini Super Trofeo North America will return to the track for its second race of the weekend tomorrow, Sunday, Aug. 6, at 10:55 a.m. (CT).

Tape-delayed coverage of Road America will air on the CBS Sports Network on Aug. 27, 2017 at 3 p.m. ET. The coverage will feature live commentary on both the broadcast and live streams.

Lamborghini Super Trofeo races will be live-streamed on the following platforms: squadracorse.lamborghini.com, motortrendondemand.com and Internationally on imsa.tv and radiolemans.com. Tape-delayed coverage of each event will air on CBS Sports Network in primetime. The coverage will feature live commentary on both the broadcast and live streams.

The North American series continues to attract increasing numbers of competitors and interest.

The Lamborghini Huracán Super Trofeo adopts the V10 direct injection engine mounted on the road car, managed by a MoTeC control unit that delivers a maximum output of 620 horsepower. The frame is a hybrid carbon/aluminum construction with modified geometries to house an improved radiator up front and better accommodate the racing gearbox at the rear, which also provides better aerodynamics.

POST-RACE QUOTES

TRENT HINDMAN (No. 1 Prestige Performance, winner, first Pro):

"That was all right. I knew we had a good car. I knew the Wayne Taylor/Prestige Performance guys gave us a good car after qualifying. It came as a little bit of a surprise though. We had no testing here and showed up a bit blind. And after all the rain and all the cancellations to our sessions due to the weather it was pretty surprising to find ourselves up there. At the end of the day we were able to capitalize on the day. I think it was a really good day in terms of the Championship for us, for myself and Riccardo [Agostini] and the Prestige Performance guys. It's what it's all about for us right now. Just capitalize on the opportunities we're given and we did exactly that. I'm really proud of the team and proud of Riccardo and the way he was able to pick up this track so quickly and be right on pace right away. We are going to try like hell to do it again tomorrow."

RICCARDO AGOSTINI (No. 1 Prestige Performance, winner, first Pro):

"It was a good race from the beginning. Trent managed the gap until the pit window opened, so I tried to do the same after the driver change. Today was a nice race. I'm really happy about that. Good also for the championship, so that's what we had to do. Hopefully for tomorrow we can get another great result. Thanks for the team, thanks to the sponsors. It's always great to race here in America. Honestly, we've been fast in practice under the rainy conditions. Hopefully we can also manage a good race tomorrow. I don't know what the weather's going to be, so let's see what's going on."
