

Virginia International Raceway Marks Halfway Point for the Lamborghini Super Trofeo North America Championship Battles



- VIRginia International Raceway is the only circuit to host Super Trofeo North America in each of its first five seasons
- Tight points battles for all championships will come into play at VIR
- The VIR race weekend will be the home race for North Carolina-based Change Racing team and its Lamborghini Carolinas dealership

SANT'AGATA, Bolognese (Aug. 21, 2017) – The Lamborghini Super Trofeo North America series is traveling southeast to VIRginia International Raceway (VIR) to kick-off the second half of its exciting 2017 season with Rounds 7 and 8, Aug. 25-27, on the scenic and fan-friendly 17-turn, 3.27-mile road course in Alton, Virginia.

A perennial favorite with drivers, teams and fans, VIR is the only track to host the series in all five of its North American seasons. Recently updated in 2000, the circuit is one of the most beautiful road courses in North America and well-suited to the Huracán Super Trofeo car.

The series competitors will enjoy two 50-minute races at VIR. Race 1 is scheduled to start at 4:40 p.m. (ET) Saturday, Aug. 26. Race 2 will start at 9:50 a.m. Sunday, Aug. 27. Two practices will take place Friday, followed by a double qualifying session Saturday morning at 10:05 a.m.

Racing in the series is divided into separate podiums, recognizing the breadth of talent in the Super Trofeo field. After each race, there is a podium for the top three finishers overall and the Pro, Pro-Am, Amateur (Am) and Lamborghini Cup divisions. The championship provides exciting action for professional and aspiring professional drivers alike.

Following rounds 5 and 6 at Road America, the championship battles are intensifying, with drivers and teams becoming even more competitive with half of the 12-round season already complete.

Coming off three wins in row, the No. 1 Prestige Performance Huracán representing Lamborghini Paramus has firmly taken control of the Pro Championship following their dominating performance at Road America. The duo of Trent Hindman and Riccardo Agostini have jumped into the points lead, but are closely followed by the No. 16 Change Racing entry of Richard Antinucci, only 6 points behind, representing Lamborghini Carolinas. Antinucci suffered an issue in Race 1 at Road America, putting him five laps down and giving up the win and the points advantage to Hindman and Agostini.
